



ADTRAC UPDATE

Working Together

Joshua was initially referred to ADTRAC by Social services and he wasn't sure of what he would like to do regarding education, training or employment. He decided that he would like to focus on education, this was important to Joshua as he had no formal qualifications.

During initial appointments with his ADTRAC Mentor different options available at college were considered and Joshua applied for courses. It became apparent that the lack of qualifications was a barrier, as he didn't meet the relevant entry requirements for courses. Following this set back a way forward was discussed with his ADTRAC Mentor and it was decided to focus on Joshua's interests. Josh mentioned that he had participated at indoor climbing centres since a young age, he enjoyed this still as a hobby and attended the Boathouse Climbing Centre in Llandudno every Tuesday evening. The ADTRAC Mentor liaising with the Communities for Work Employment Mentor were able to source a placement for Josh. His Mentor by way of a more visually focused activity supported Josh to complete a CV.

Josh's case is a key example of an effective multi-agency approach with other professionals providing support alongside ADTRAC Mentors.

Josh is still volunteering at the Boathouse climbing centre and ADTRAC are currently looking at providing an indoor climbing assistant qualification for him. Hopefully this will support him with the skill set to use this towards employment, training or education.

Trafododd y Mentor ADTRAC hyn gyda Mentor Cyflogadwyedd Cymunedau'n Gyntaf a bu iddynt gael lleoliad gwaith i Josh. Drwy wneud pethau'n fwy gweladwy, cafodd Josh ei gefnogi gan ei Fentor i gwblhau CV. Mae Josh yn enghraift wych o ddull amlasant aethol effeithiol gyda gweithwyr proffesiynol eraill yn rhoi cymorth ochr yn ochr â Mentoraid ADTRAC.
