Y POLISI YNGHYLCH CYNALIADWYEDD A'R AMGYLCHEDD

Ffurfiwyd Grŵp Llandrillo Menai fis Ebrill 2012 yn dilyn uno Coleg Llandrillo, Coleg Menai a Choleg Meirion-Dwyfor. Mae gan y Grŵp safleoedd yn siroedd Conwy, Dinbych, Gwynedd ac Ynys Môn, ynghyd â darpariaeth mewn nifer o leoliadau yn y gymuned. Darpara'r Grŵp amrediad eang o addysg a hyfforddiant llawn amser a rhan-amser, ar lefel Addysg Bellach ac Addysg Uwch. Cyfloga tua 2,100 aelod staff a bydd tua 34,000 o fyfyrwyr yn cofrestru ar ei gyrsiau bob blwyddyn.

Ymdrecha Grŵp Llandrillo Menai i addysgu ei holl staff a'i holl fyfyrwyr ynghylch materion amgylcheddol a chynaliadwyedd, rhai lleol a rhai byd-eang, gan feithrin eu hymwybyddiaeth o'r sefydliad fel asiant amgylcheddol.

Amcanion y Polisi:

Gwneud cynaliadwyedd, yr arferion amgylcheddol gorau a dinasyddiaeth fyd-eang yn rhan o bob agwedd ar fywyd y Coleg.

Sicrhau y cydymffurfir â phob deddfwriaeth berthnasol ac y mabwysiedir polisiau a fydd yn cyfrannu at ddyfodol cynaliadwy.

Sicrhau y datblygir ac y mabwysiedir trefn o ran rheoli'r amgylchedd a fydd yn atal llygredd ac yn sicrhau gwelliant parhaus ym mherfformiad amgylcheddol y Coleg.

Hybu ymwybyddiaeth pawb yn y Coleg mewn perthynas â defnyddio ynni a dŵr, gan eu hannog i wneud defnydd mwy effeithlon o'r adnoddau hyn.

Defnyddio llai o ddefnyddiau ble bynnag y bo modd, ac ymestyn oes defnyddiau ble bynnag y bo hynny'n ymarferol.

Ailgylchu neu aildefnyddio defnyddiau ble bynnag y bo modd a chael gwared ar wastraff yn y modd sy'n lleiaf niweidiol i'r amgylchedd.

Sicrhau bod y Coleg yn cael cyn lleied o effaith negyddol â phosibl ar yr amgylchedd lleol a'i fod yn cyfrannu'n gadarnhaol i'r gymuned leol a'i hamgylchedd.

Sicrhau bod holl fyfyrwyr a staff y Coleg yn ymwybodol o faterion amgylcheddol, a darparu amrediad o gyrsiau a hyfforddiant ar bynciau perthnasol.

Sicrhau bod yr holl staff a'r holl fyfyrwyr yn ymwybodol o effeithiau trafndiaeth ar yr amgylchedd, a'u hannog i ddefnyddio dulliau amgen o deithio.

Monitro'n rheolaidd y cynnydd a wneir er mwyn gweld lle gellir gwneud gwelliannau.

SUSTAINABILITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Grŵp Llandrillo Menai was formed in April 2012 following the merger between Coleg Llandrillo, Coleg Menai and Coleg Meirion Dwyfor. The Grŵp has sites in Conwy, Denbighshire, Gwynedd and Anglesey with provision at a large number of community based venues. The Grŵp provides a wide range of education and training, both full and part-time, at Further and Higher Education levels and has approximately 2,100 staff and attracts about 34,000 students.

Grŵp Llandrillo Menai seeks to develop, amongst all its staff and students, an understanding of environmental and sustainability issues, both local and global, and an appreciation of the institution as an environmental agent.

Objectives of the Policy:

To make sustainability, environmental best practice and global citizenship part of every aspect of College life.

To ensure compliance with all relevant legislation and adopt policies which will contribute to a sustainable future.

To ensure the development and adoption of an environmental management system which prevents pollution and ensures continual improvement in the College's environmental performance.

To promote awareness of energy and water use amongst all members of the College and to improve the efficiency in use of these resources.

To reduce the consumption of materials where possible and to extend the life of materials where practicable.

To recycle or re-use materials where possible and to dispose of waste in the least environmentally damaging way.

To ensure that the College has a minimal negative effect on the local environment and makes a positive contribution to the local community and its environment.

To ensure that all students and College staff are aware of environmental issues and to provide a range of courses and training in relevant topics.

To ensure that all staff and students are aware of the environmental impacts of transport and to encourage the use of alternative forms of transport.

To monitor progress on a regular basis to identify areas for improvement.
